

In 1992 Henry J. (Hank) Hatch retired as an Army Lieutenant General having served as the Chief of Engineers and Commander of the Army Corps of Engineers responsible for military construction and the Corps' water resources program. He is an active volunteer in several professional organizations including the National Research Council of the National Academies of Engineering, Science and Medicine and the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE). Hatch earned his Bachelors from West Point and his Masters from The Ohio State University. He is a registered professional engineer in the District of Columbia, a Distinguished Member of ASCE, a Distinguished Graduate of West Point, a Distinguished Alumnus of the College of Engineering of The Ohio State University, and a member of the National Academy of Engineering.

The lecture series honors Albert Dorman, an architect and civil engineer who is a USC alumnus and the founding chairman of AECOM Technology Corporation. He is the first person to become both a Fellow of the American Institute of Architects and an Honorary Member of the American Society of Civil Engineering (ASCE). He is a member of the National Academy of Engineering and the winner of the ASCE Outstanding Lifetime Achievement Award in Leadership.
